### ***Sydney founded***

A fleet of eleven ships sailed into Botany Bay on the eastern coast of Australia between 18 and 20 January 1788. Most of the 1,030 people on board were convicts - 548 men and 188 women who had been sentenced to transportation for various crimes committed in Britain. The British government had thought that it was undesirable and expensive to keep these people in British prisons, and in any case, it could find nowhere else to send them. Criminals previously sentenced to transportation had been sent to American colonies, but those colonies had broken away in the American Revolution.

The convicts were therefore sent to Botany Bay, which was as far away from Britain as possible to sail. They were guarded by a detachment of marines, consisting of 211 officers and men. There was also a chaplain, a surveyor-general, a judge-advocate and several naval surgeons. There were twenty-seven wives of marines and civil officers, and thirty-seven children. The expedition was under the command of Captain Arthur Phillip, R.N., who had been appointed governor of New South Wales. The naval officers of the first fleet that arrived in January 1788 were not impressed with Botany Bay as an anchorage, nor with the potential of the land around it, and they decided to look elsewhere. Captain Phillip sailed northwards along the coast and found the entrance to Port Jackson. He then established a settlement at Sydney Cove, six miles inside the harbour. The move from Botany Bay was completed by 26 January 1788.

Captain Collins, judge-advocate, was the first person to start keeping the what would become the State records.

Governor Phillip addressed the convicts on On 3 February 1788 as follows:

The convicts were order'd to sit down, and the Governor made an harangue to them, telling them he had try'd them hitherto to see how they were disposed, that he was thoroughly convinced they were many of them incorrigible, and that he was convinced nothing but severity w'd have any effect upon them to induce them to behave properly. He also assur'd them if they attempted by night to get into the women's tents there were positive orders for the centry to fire upon them; that they had been very idle, wandering ab't the country, and not more than 200 out of 600 convicts were at work; that the industrious sh'd not labour for the idle; if they did not work they sh'd not eat; that in England if thieving poultry was to be punish'd w'h death in consequence of their being so easily supply'd, but here a fowl was of the utmost consequence to the settlement, as well as every other species of stock, as they were reserved for breed, therefore stealing the most trifling article of stock or provissions sh'd be punish'd with death; that however such severity might militate against his humanity and feelings, yet justice demanded such rigid execution of the laws, and they might implicitly rely upon justice taking place. Their labour w'd not be equal to that a husbandman in England endures who has a wife and family to provide for; they w'd never be work'd beyond their abilities, but everyone sh'd contribute his share in order to render himself and the community at large happy and comfortable; as soon as the nature of the settlement w'd admit of, that they sh'd be employ'd erecting houses for the different

officers, the soldiers, and afterwards for themselves. After this harangue they were dismiss'd in the same form in which they were assembl'd. The Governor had a cold collation under a large tent, to which the general officers were invited.

For most of the convict woman, life was uncertain and brutish. Marriage, legal or de facto, was a necessity for physical protection from the hundreds of convicts, soldiers and seamen, as well as a means of ensuring them a regular supply of food. There was little clothing in the government store and only the barest of protection from the weather during the winter of 1788. As most of the woman were illiterate, they left no record of their misfortunes and injustices. But one of them managed to smuggle a letter back home. This letter read:

I take the first opportunity that has been given us to acquaint you with our disconsolate situation in this solitary waste of the creation. Our passage, you may have heard by the first ships, was tolerably favourable; but the inconveniences since suffered for want of shelter, bedding, & c., are not to be imagined by any stranger. However, we have now two streets, if four rows of the most miserable huts you can possibly conceive of deserve that name. Windows they have none, as from the Governor's house, & c., now nearly finished, no glass could be spared; so that lattices of twigs are made by our people to supply their places. At the extremity of the lines, where since our arrival the dead are buried, there is a place called the church-yard; but we hear, as soon as a sufficient quantity of bricks can be made, a church is to be built, and named St. Philip, after the Governor. Notwithstanding all our presents, the savages still continue to do us all the injury they can, which makes the soldiers' duty very hard, and much dissatisfaction among the officers. I know not how many of our people have been killed. As for the distresses of the women, they are past description, as they are deprived of tea and other things they were indulged in in the voyage by the seamen, and as they are totally unprovided with clothes, those who have young children are quite wretched. Beside this, though a number of marriages have taken place, several women, who have become pregnant on the voyage, and are since left by their partners, who have returned to England, are not likely even here to form any fresh connections. We are comforted with the hopes of a supply of tea from China, and flattered with getting riches when the settlement is complete, and the hemp which the place produces is brought to perfection. Our kangaroo rats are like mutton, but much leaner; and there is a kind of chickweed so much in taste like our spinach that no difference can be discerned. Something like ground ivy is used for tea; but a scarcity of salt and sugar makes our best meals insipid. The separation of several of us to an uninhabited island was like a second transportation. In short, every one is so taken up with their own misfortunes that they no pity to bestow upon others. All our letters are examined by an officer, but a friend takes this for me privately. The ships sail tomorrow.

### ***The discovery of the Nepean River***

The discovery of the Nepean River in 1789 by Captain Tench was of great significance in the agricultural history of New South Wales, because the alluvial flats surrounding it proved to be very fertile and productive. The Nepean River flowed along the foothills of the Blue Mountains, commonly called by that name from the early days of settlement, and its connexion with the Hawkesbury River was not known until some time later. Captain Tench describes his expedition as follows:

On the 26th instant, accompanied by Mr. Arndell, assistant surgeon of the settlement, Mr. Lowes, surgeon's mat of the Sirius, two marines, and a convict, I left the redoubt at day-break, pointing our march to a hill, distant five miles, in a westerly or inland direction, which commands a view of the great chain of mountains, called Carmarthen-hills [*now known as the Blue Mountains*], extending from north to south farther than the eye can reach. Here we paused, surveying "the wild abyss; pondering our voyage." Before us lay the trackless immeasurable desert, in awful silence. At length, after consultation, we determined to steer west and by north, by compass, the make of the land in that quarter indicating the existence of a river. We continued to march all day through a country untrodden before by an European foot. Save that a melancholy crow now and then flew croaking over head, or a kangaroo was seen toss bound at a distance, the picture of solitude was complete and undisturbed. At four o'clock in the afternoon we halted near a small pond of water, where we took up our residence for the night, lighted a fire, and prepared to cook our supper: - that was, to broil over a couple of ramrods a few slices of salt pork, and a crow which we had shot. At daylight we renewed our peregrination; and in hour after we found ourselves on the banks of a river, nearly as broad as the Thames at Putney, and apparently of great depth, the current running very slowly in a northerly direction.

To this river the governor gave the name of Nepean. The distance of the part of the river which we first hit upon from the sea coast, is about 39 miles, in a direct line, almost due west.

### ***Historical background to the Colonial Secretary***

Ten different men served as Secretary to the Governor, or to the colony, or 'to Government', in the 22 years before Governor Macquarie arrived, with an average tenure of office of less than two years, allowing for vacancies. The arrangements were not conducive to good record-keeping.

The arrival of Governor Macquarie at the end of 1809 brought to the office of Secretary to the Governor probably the ablest and most experienced man who had yet filled it, one who was to hold it for the longest period, and who, as its last occupant under the old style, was to be the link between the older casual system of court appointments and the new method of permanent appointment by commission from the Crown. In his 11 years of office, the methodical John Thomas Campbell greatly improved the situation in respect of the public records of the colony, and the greater part of the surviving records date from this period.

Generally, a new order and regularity was established in the performance of the public business during the 12 years

As a penal colony the ratio of the sexes was two to one male to female. Governor Macquarie issued a proclamation for people cohabiting to marry, and also advised his superiors to cease sending women to the Colony. A Select Committee was appointed to report on Transportation, and in its consideration of the best interests and growth prospects of the colony it disagreed with Macquarie. Its report on conditions is as follow (p. 12 P.P. 1812, II, 341):

In the distribution of female convicts great abuses have formerly prevailed; they were indiscriminately given to such of the inhabitants as demanded them, and were in general received rather as prostitutes than as servants; and so far from being induced to reform themselves, the disgraceful manner in which they were disposed of, operated as an encouragement to general depravity of manners. Upon the arrival of Governor Bligh, two-thirds of the children annually born within the Colony were illegitimate. Marriages have latterly become more frequent, consequently prostitution is stated to have been less prevalent; and Governor Macquarie is directing his endeavours, under order from the Government here, "to keep the female convicts separate till they can properly be distributed among the inhabitants, in such a manner as they may best derive the advantages of industry and good character." He further states in his dispatch, dated April 30, 1810, that the situation in the Colony requires that as many male convicts as possible should be sent thither, the prosperity of the country depending on their numbers; whilst, on the contrary, female convicts are as a great drawback as the others are beneficial. To this observation Your Committee feel they cannot accede: they are aware that the women sent out are of the most abandoned description, and that in many instances they are likely to whet and encourage the vices of the men, whilst but a small proportion of them will make any step towards reformation; but yet, with all their vices, such women as these were the mothers of a great part of the inhabitants now existing in the Colony, and from this stock only can a reasonable hope be held out of a rapid increase to the population; upon which increase, here as in all infant colonies, its growing prosperity in great measure depends. Let it be remembered too, how much misery and vice are likely to prevail in a society in which women bear no proportion to the men; in the Colony at present, the number of men compared to that of women is as 2 to 1; to this, in great measure, the prevalence of prostitution is reasonably to be attributed; but increase that proportion, and the temptation to abandoned vices will also be increased, and the hopes of establishing feelings of decency and morality amongst the lower classes will be still farther removed.
